#### You need:

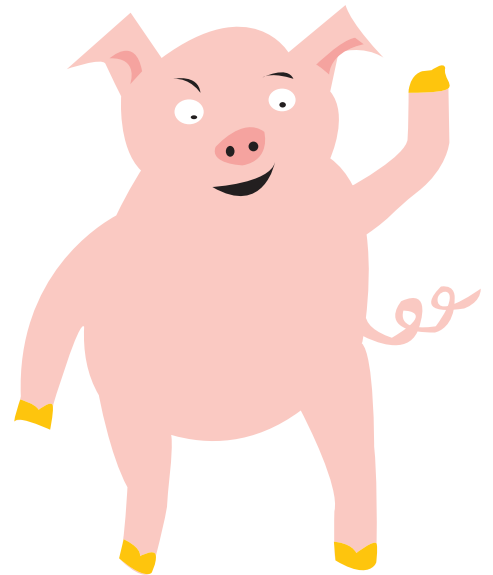
- Pattern
- Transfer Pencil or regular pencil
- Embroidery floss (pink, black/dark grey, yellow/orange)
- Sharp needle (whatever size you like)
- Embroidery hoop
- Small sharp scissors (my Mom had a great pair that the handles were wings and the point a bird beak; this isn't required, though)
- Fabric! Whatever you are stitching on.

#### Two ways to get your design onto fabric:

1) Use a transfer pencil and trace over the pattern, then use the pattern like an iron-on.

2) If your fabric is see-through-enough (made-up phrase I enjoy saying), then just put your pattern underneath your fabric and use a regular pencil to trace the design onto your fabric. You could print the design extra dark or go over it with a marker first so it is easier to see it through your fabric.

Okay, actually three ways: carbon paper.



#### Stitches & Colors:

**Black dots**= Black French Knots (snout holes and eyeballs)

**Solid areas of color**= Satin Stitch [hooves (yellow or orange), ear insides (pink), snout (pink), mouth (grey or black), eyebrows (grey or black)]

**Lines**= Back stitch or Stem Stitch or Outline Stitch (pink for pig and black or dark grey for eye circle)
